

Crawford Farms of Kentucky is looking to add a resident veterinarian to their team. The Resident Vet will direct the daily veterinary care of the broodmares, foals, and weanlings and will need to be available for veterinary emergencies on the farm. They will be responsible for the ordering and maintenance of the farm's veterinary inventory. The veterinarian will coordinate care primarily with the farm manager of the Kentucky farm but will also be in contact with the general manager and the resident veterinarian at the New York farm as needed. Applicants should have an interest in reproduction and neonatology.

Crawford Farms foals out and breeds around 100 mares per year, predominantly Standardbreds. These mares are divided between the New York and Kentucky farms. Crawford Farm of Kentucky is looking to added foaling to the farm this year with the anticipation of foaling roughly half of the mares. Most of the mares will be bred using AI with fresh cooled semen, there may be a few being bred using frozen semen. The veterinarian will be responsible for palpating and breeding the mares, and for the care of the foals born on the farm. In the fall most/to all the weanlings will be moved to the New York farm and will spend the year there until they are sold.

Applicants will need to qualify for a Kentucky veterinary license, a DEA license, and USDA accreditation.
