ROLES and RESPONSIBILITIES



JUNIOR and CABIN COUNSELORS (about 30 positions)

Hired to lead a cabin of kids through a successful week of camp. This includes, but is not limited to, following a schedule, leading program areas, resolving conflict, making sure campers shower/brush teeth/eat at meals, camper paperwork and putting campers to bed.



PROGRAM STAFF (about 3 positions)

Hired for a specific activity and will be responsible for that activity every day. Some certifications may be necessary to complete (rock climbing certification course, lifeguarding certifications, etc.). Will also help with unit and camper supervision.



UNIT LEADERS and COUNSELOR IN TRAINING (CIT) DIRECTORS (about 6 positions)

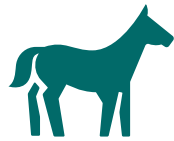
Hired to oversee a specific unit of campers and staff. Unit leaders live in and work with a cabin of kids, while also assisting in resolving conflict, maintaining the schedule and conducting evaluations for the unit.

TIME OFF and LODGING



You'll receive **24 hours off** each week and **daily breaks** of 2 total hours.



Cabins have screened windows, bunk beds, ceiling fans and electricity, and accommodate 10-12 people. Bathroom/shower facilities are in each unit.



You'll receive **3 meals** a day (while camp is in session/you are on-site), **WiFi** (to be used on your break), and access to our weekly **nurses**.
